OUR COMMUNITY

Our Home – Cathedral Park will be a unique cohousing community and the flagship development of <u>Our Home</u>, <u>ICC</u>. The project will champion a groundbreaking approach to building community, combining innovative design and thoughtful management to host a variety of home ownership opportunities for individuals and families of diverse abilities, ages, and income levels.

This new community will reside in the heart of Portland's iconic Cathedral Park neighborhood in the shadow of the St. Johns Bridge. The incredible location is just minutes from downtown, convenient to public transportation, a short hike to Forest Park, and comfortably walkable to many restaurants, bars, shops, and the beautiful Cathedral Park.

Ambitious plans such as these do not come together on their own. Our Home, ICC and the Founding Neighbors of Our Home–Cathedral Park have set up an entity to oversee the project known as Platypus Community, LLC. This organization is working to complete the OHCP community by bringing together the OHCP community members and is benefiting from the committed assistance of skilled and generous partners:

- Community Vision, a local nonprofit working to support families and individuals experiencing disability
- Proud Ground, the largest Community Land Trust in the Pacific Northwest
- <u>Urban Development + Partners</u>, a Portland development firm with extensive experience in multifamily construction and cohousing development


While this brochure is an introduction to our cohousing framework, Our Home – Cathedral Park is not complete without your voice. We welcome you to help fill in the blanks, and in doing so build a shared home that extends the benefits of cohousing to a broad, representative community and sets a high standard for future Our Home projects to emulate.

WHAT IS COHOUSING?

Contemporary cohousing originated in Denmark 60 years ago and planted its first roots in the US in the 1990s. The concept combines homeownership with shared values and communal spaces to create an environment where individuals and families can build their lives and community together.

THE DETAILS

- Estimated completion: 2022
- Located at North Edison Street and North Burlington Street in North Portland
- Accessible, universally-designed condo homes including studio, 1, 2, 3 bedroom units
- · Conventional ownership of individual units
- Shared landscaped courtyard and interior community gathering spaces
- · Several subsidized units for qualifying individuals
- A strong, supportive, and fun community of neighbors!





Good design should accommodate all user needs.

Cohousing provides the opportunity to support the needs of all residents through community support and demands an architecture that reflects these values. Our Home-Cathedral Park considers not just Universal Design, but also overlapping needs of specific users to produce spaces that are inclusive for all.



Neurodiversity

Designing for neurodiversity considers the variation of cognitive functioning within our communities, allowing users control over sensory stimulation providing organizational clarity.




DeafSpace Guidelines

PLACEMAKING AND A BEACON TO THE COMMUNITY

Our Home – Cathedral Park is a community of 28 homes on a site overlooking the Willamette River, the St. Johns Bridge, and Forest Park. The open and airy common house greets the Cathedral Park neighborhood with floor-to-ceiling windows and a rooftop terrace.

YOUR NEW HOME

Each unit provides an open and flexible layout that allows for an abundance of natural light. Select units offer spectacular views of the St. Johns Bridge and the West Hills beyond. Connections to the Our Home community are enhanced by Juliet balconies and courtyard-facing kitchens.



EMBRACING DIVERSITY: A COMMUNITY FOR ALL



This is the basement level of Our Home – Cathedral Park, and it contains shared amenities such as parking for 15 vehicles, oversized bike storage, a dog washing station, laundry facilities (all units also include washer/dryer connections), and a trash/recycling/compost room.

There is also a private guest suite for residents who have family, friends or a caretaker visiting for an overnight stay.



This is the main level of Our Home – Cathedral Park and it contains shared amenities, including a mail area and community spaces such as a living room, kitchen and a multi-use dining space. (Please note that the community space layouts are not finalized and we look forward to design input from early community members.) There are ten units on this level and five of these units have private patios.


This is level three of Our Home – Cathedral Park. There are ten units on this level connected by outdoor covered walkways and bridges.

A large roof deck is available for use by all residents, regardless of which floor they live on.



This is level four of Our Home – Cathedral Park. There are eight units on this level connected by outdoor covered walkways.

Our Home is solar-ready, with ideal rooftop orientations to maximize on-site generation of electricity (as shown above).




MEET YOUR NEIGHBORS!
